



Year 3 — Term 3

English	We are looking at recounts in the form of a letter. The children will learn the features of letter writing and write a formal and informal letter.
Maths	We will be continuing with multiplication and division. We will also be looking at length, and how to calculate the perimeter of a shape.
Science	We are continuing our unit about animals and skeletons. The children will learn that animals including humans get the nutrients that they need from food, balanced diet, internal and external skeletons, name the parts of a human skeleton and the uses of these bones.
History	Would you prefer to live in the Stone Age, Bronze Age or Iron Age? The children will learn how long ago the prehistoric man lived, what Skara Brae tells us about life in the Stone Age and how life changed from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.
PSHE	In PSHE we are looking at keeping safe. The children will explore different situations which are safe and unsafe and learning the difference between danger and risk.
Music	In Music, we will be playing and creating pentatonic melodies, and composing a piece of music using layered melodies, based on the Chinese New Year.
Computing	In Computing, we will be learning about email, its uses, how we send emails and their use in daily life.
RE	In RE the children will be learning about religious festivals and why they are important to religious communities.
PE	In PE this half term, the children will be learning dance and how to use space such as travelling actions, perform on different levels and speeds. We will also have forest school.
Art	Form and space— Relating to our learning in History, the children will be researching stone clay pots and decorations. We will be making a clay pot using different skills and techniques to get their desired outcome.
MFL	In Spanish, we will be learning numbers 1-20 and how to say some colours in Spanish, to describe some simple items.

Core Text
