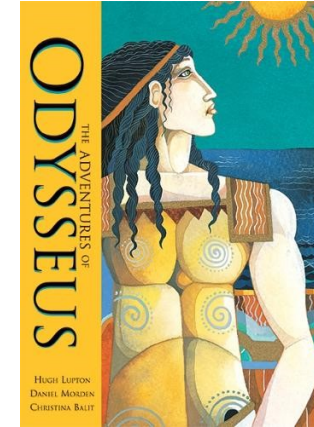




Year 5 — Term 3

English	In writing, we will learn to use the correct tone or style for the audience, put events in chronological order, write in the past tense, use of first and third pronouns, descriptive devices and emotive language.
Maths	In maths we will be continuing with fractions - comparing, ordering, adding and subtracting. We will also return to multiplication, using formal methods and solving problems.
Science	In science we will be learning about life cycles - all living things have different stages of life, some animals lay eggs, comparing life cycles of different animals and reproduction in plants.
History	In history we will be learning about ancient Greece. We will explore what the Greeks did for us, how ancient Greece was governed, the importance of the philosophers and their achievements.
PSHE	In PSHE we will be learning about keeping safe. We will look at spotting bullying, recognising risky situations and how to deal with them and the possible outcomes of taking risks.
Music	In music we will continue to learn how to play the flute. We will learn new notes and continue to play simple music, both individually and in groups.
Computing	In Computing we will continue to learn about online safety. We will also learn to create games using simple coding.
RE	In RE we will be learning about why we go to a place of worship if God is everywhere. We will explore different places of worship, their purpose and how believers see these places.
PE	In PE we will be doing gymnastics and dance. We will learn to use a range of specific vocabulary, work effectively as a team, how to compose sequences, evaluate and critic others' performances.
Art/DT	In art/DT we will be learning about form and space. We will research ancient Greek pottery, clay sculpting and handmade pottery methods. We will then use these methods to produce a clay pot.
MFL	In Spanish we will be learning about habitats. We will learn how to present information, both orally and written. We will also learn months, days and the numbers 1 to 31.
